



It tells us about the length of ten rivers, and the water bodies they discharge their waters into. The Amazon river is 6400 km long and discharges its waters into the Atlantic Ocean. Whereas, the river Hudson which is 507 km and Kennet i.e. just 72 km in length discharge their waters into the New York Bay and Thames respectively. The Mississippi that runs 3734 km in length, meets the Gulf of Mexico. Similarly, Nile and Seine, the former 6853 km and the latter 776 km thus discharge into the Mediterrean and English Channel respectively. The length of River Thames is 346 km and empties itself into the North Sea. The Tyrrhenian Sea gets its its waters from the river tiber which is 405 km in length.
